## NuoumOrAc

River Detectives is an exciting education initiative of Catchment Management Authorities (CMA's) inspiring teachers and students to understand, appreciate and care for their local waterway through engaging, cross-curricular, citizen-science activities.
River Detectives - many valuable learning opportunities;

- skills and knowledge in science, maths, literacy, humanities, sustainability, art . . .
- monthly testing for pH , electrical conductivity (salinity), turbidity, reactive phosphorus and temperature
- learn about river health, waterways, catchments, water science, flora, fauna, urban stormwater, litter, erosion, land management, life/water cycles, ecosystems, Aboriginal cultures . . .
- provides real-life contexts for learning using real data from your local environment - provides opportunities for your students to become environmental leaders / custodians / changemakers and educate your school / wider community about the importance of waterway health
- fantastic opportunities to link with community groups and participate in hands-on environmental rehabilitation work at your waterway or within your catchment
- lends itself strongly to strengthening community links ie. get involved with your local Landcare group/council/landholders to revegetate your waterway, learn about the history of your waterway, hear stories from older residents about the life and times of your waterway (droughts, floods, recreation), connect with traditional owner groups to learn about cultural practices.
- ties in well with other initiatives such as Clean Up Australia Day, National Tree

Day, Science Week, Water Week, ResourceSmart, etc
In summary, the River Detectives is an engaging,
citizen-science, community/sustainability program that will help your students value waterways as the life-blood of the land - a very important value in these times of environmental change. Take a look at the website https://www.riverdetectives.net.au/ to get a feel for the program
